

Elementary and Middle School attendance zones slightly revised for 2017-2018

The Dickinson ISD Board of Trustees approved a few revisions to the elementary and middle school attendance zones for the 2017-2018 school year to accommodate the district's continually increasing student enrollment. Letters were sent home with elementary and middle school students affected by the changes. Student records will be sent to the new home campus automatically. Parents will still need to complete the yearly online registration process during August 1-15, 2017. If parents have questions about which school their child is zoned to attend for the 2017-2018 school year, they can input their address into an online database available on the Dickinson ISD website at www.dickinsonisd.org.

Elementary Attendance Boundaries

The district's newest elementary, Lobit Elementary, opened last August with almost 700 students, which is much more than originally anticipated, while Bay Colony Elementary is home to 768 students. Calder Road Elementary and Hughes Road Elementary were both in the mid-500's for student enrollment.

By making these elementary attendance zone changes, the attendance numbers should be more even among the elementary campuses and leave needed space at Lobit for students moving into new developments west of I-45. Two areas currently zoned to Lobit will be changing, including one area of homes along Calder Road, which will move back to Calder Road Elementary and another area of homes

east of I-45 near Mall of the Mainland, which will move back to Hughes Road Elementary. At Bay Colony Elementary, an area east of I-45 between FM 517 and Deats Road will be rezoned to Calder Road Elementary.

Middle School Attendance Boundaries

In order to balance student numbers and plan for future growth, the boundaries for Barber Middle School and Dunbar Middle School have been revised. There are no changes to the Lobit Middle School boundary. The 2016-2017 boundaries zoned half of the students from Silbernagel Elementary to Barber, while the other half attended Dunbar. The new 2017-2018 boundaries have all students zoned to Silbernagel attending Dunbar Middle School. Middle School boundaries are as follows.

- Barber Middle School The majority of students from Hughes Road Elementary and San Leon Elementary, plus students attending the STEM Academy
- Dunbar Middle School Students from Bay Colony Elementary, Silbernagel Elementary, K.E. Little Elementary and some San Leon Elementary students
- Lobit Middle School Students from Lobit Elementary, Calder Road Elementary and some students from Hughes Road Elementary

Online Registration available for Returning Students

From August 1-15, 2017, Dickinson ISD parents will be able to take advantage of the district's online registration process for returning students. These are students who attend a Dickinson ISD campus at the end of the 2016-2017 school year and will be returning for the 2017-2018 school year.

A copy of proof of residency is still required to be dropped off at the campus; however, this can be done in August before school starts, without having to stand in a registration line.

The online registration process will be available through the school district website at www.dickinsonisd.org. The district will have complete instructions on the website this summer to walk parents through the steps they need to take.

In order to complete the online registration process, parents must have their login information (user name and password) for Skyward Family Access. If a parent does not have login information, this can be obtained by showing proper identification in the front office at their child's school. Please make sure you have obtained login information ahead of time so you are not delayed in registering your student online. For parents without access to the Internet, computers and assistance will be available at the campuses during designated times to complete the online registration process.

Parents of students new to Dickinson ISD for 2017-2018 must visit the campus their child will attend and complete the registration process in person as there is more paperwork involved.

Returning students to Dickinson ISD may complete the online registration process:

Online registration will be available August 1-15, 2017 for families of returning Dickinson ISD students through the Skyward Family Access Site. A copy of proof of residency is still required. Please drop off a copy of proof of residency at the front office to your child's elementary school between the hours of 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. Monday-Friday, August 1-15, 2017. Please put the name(s) of your student(s) and their grade level for 2017-2018 on the proof of residency so we can validate your residential status for all students active at our campus. Proof of Residency includes a current gas, water, electricity bill or lease in the parent's name. If the bill/lease is NOT in parent/guardian's name, additional forms will be required including the service of a notary to complete the registration process in order to validate enrollment.

Assistance for individuals who request help with online registration will be offered at campuses during New Student Registration from 1-7 p.m. August 3 and 8 a.m.-12 p.m. August 4.

When coming to register your new DISD student(s), parents/guardians must bring COPIES of the following documents for each child Pre-Kindergarten through 4th grade:

- Student's Birth Certificate, Immunization Record, Social Security Card, Medication information
- Valid parent ID, (Driver's License, passport, military ID);
- Court paperwork for Guardianship(s);
- Proof of Residency (current gas, water, electricity bill or lease in parent's name; If the bill/lease is NOT in parent/guardian's name, additional forms will be required including the service of a notary to complete the registration process in order to validate enrollment;
- Copy of Divorce/Custody documents, if applicable;
- Special Education/Section 504 information, if applicable;
- Copy of last report card if transferring from another District.

Kindergarten students must be 5 years old on or before September 1. Pre-Kindergarten students must be 4 years old on or before September 1 and meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Student is unable to speak or comprehend the English language;
- Student is economically disadvantaged with proof parental/family income & benefits;
- Student is homeless;
- · Student is child of active duty member of the U.S. Armed Forces
- Student is the child of a member of the U.S. Armed Forces that was killed or injured while on active duty;
- Student is or ever was in the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services following an adversary hearing.

Enrollment Procedures for Homeless Students: Gator Families in Transition

The McKinney-Vento Act requires all local educational agencies to immediately enroll students in homeless situations, even if they do not have the required documents, such as school records, medical records, proof of residency and other documents.

Current Student Registration:

For 2017-2018, Dickinson ISD will use an online process for current student registration. Please drop off a copy of proof of residency at the front office between the hours of 7 a.m. - 3 p.m. Monday-Friday, August 1-15, 2017 or email it to lcook@dickinsonisd.org. Please put the name(s) of your student(s) and their grade level for 2017-2018 on the document. Proof of Residency includes a current gas, water, electricity bill or lease in the parent's name; If the bill/lease is NOT in parent/guardian's name, additional forms will be required, including the service of a notary, to complete the registration process.

August 1- August 15, 2017

Online Registration for all current DISD students will be open August 1-15, 2017. Parents must have access to Skyward in order to do the registration process. The student's Skyward access does not have the capabilities to do the online registration. Instructions for completing the online registration are available on the Dickinson ISD website. All address changes require proof of residence (current water/electric/gas bill, lease agreement or property tax statement). Proof of residence may be dropped off in the front office. Students not registered by August 15 may not have bus transportation for approximately one week unless there is already a designated stop.

August 3 - August 4, 2017

DHS will have a computer lab open from 7:30-11 a.m. and 12-3 p.m. to assist families with completing the online registration process.

First Day Schedule Pick-up, August 22, 2017

All Dickinson High School students will report to their NaviGATOR class on the first day of school, August 22, 2017. Student names will be posted in various locations around the building indicating the student's assigned NaviGATOR room number. During NaviGATOR, student schedules will be distributed.

Parking Permits

Parking permits are required for all student vehicles. Students will be assigned a parking space in a designated school parking lot. In order to purchase a parking permit, students must present a valid Texas Driver's License and proof of insurance for the vehicle with the student listed as an authorized driver. Parking spaces are limited and will be sold on a space-available basis. Parking permits must be permanently affixed to the inside of the front windshield on the lower right-hand (passenger) side of the windshield. Parking permits are NOT TRANSFERRABLE to a vehicle other than the one for which the permit was purchased. Any vehicle parked in the school parking lot without a valid parking permit is subject to removal at the owner's expense. Parking permits are \$30 each and will be available for purchase the first week of school and on an as needed basis throughout the school year.

Dickinson Continuation Center

DHS students who applied for DCC AND have RECEIVED an acceptance letter must attend the mandatory parent/student DCC meeting at 10 a.m. August 10, 2017 on the DCC campus. Current proof of residency must be brought in at this time. Computers will be available at the meeting to complete online registration. DCC online registration will be open from August 10-15.

GRADES PK-6

PANTS, SLACKS, JEANS, SKIRTS, DRESSES, JUMPERS, SHORTS, SHIRTS, BLOUSES OR PULLOVERS:

- May be any color or design
- Shall be appropriately sized with no holes or tears, fitting at the waist, and cuffed/hemmed at or below mid-calf.
- Shorts may be no shorter than mid-thigh in length with a hem. No cut off shorts or athletic/gym shorts.
- The length/slits of skirts, dresses, and jumpers must be clearly below mid-thigh.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers must have sleeves and must be appropriately sized and buttoned.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers may not be sheer, lace, or any see-through material (even if worn with an undergarment/ camisole/slip), backless, cut-out, off-the shoulder, spaghetti strap, sundress, tankstyle, sleeveless, low-cut, back exposed, or revealing in any way
- No vinyl, leather, suede, fleece, spandex/stretch, oversized pockets, pajamas, overalls, sweatpants, or coveralls.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.
- Underclothes may not be worn as outer clothes, including men's T shirts.

OUTSIDE JACKETS AND COATS

- All jackets/coats that are ¾ lengths (or less) are acceptable.
- "Trench" coats or "Dusters" are not allowed.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.

SHOES

- Shoes must be safe and appropriate for school.
- No house slippers, slides, flip flops, or shoes with skates, wheels or cleats.

<u>HAIR</u>

- Hair (including facial hair) must be neat, clean, and well-groomed.
- No distracting/extreme styles or unnatural coloring (pink, green, blue, etc.).

BACKPACKS

- May be any fabric.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.

PROHIBITED ITEMS:

- Glitter, writing or drawing on the face or skin
- Tattoos (temporary and permanent)
- Sunglasses
- Any type of head covering (no cap, hat, hair net, hair rollers, combs, or picks may be worn inside the building)
- Body piercing other than the ear
- Heavy chains, heavy chain necklaces, spike necklaces, or other inappropriate types of jewelry

GRADES 7-12

PANTS, SLACKS, JEANS, SKIRTS, DRESSES, JUMPERS, (NO SHORTS OR SKORTS), SHIRTS, BLOUSES OR PULLOVERS:

- May be any color or design
- Shall be appropriately sized with no holes or tears, fitting at the waist, and cuffed/hemmed at or below mid-calf
- The length/slits of skirts, dresses, and jumpers must be clearly below, and remain below, the mid-thigh, including the front, back, and sides when standing, sitting, or walking.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers must have sleeves. Must be appropriately sized and buttoned.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers may not be sheer, lace, or any see-through material (even if worn with an undergarment/ camisole/slip), backless, cut-out, off-the shoulder, spaghetti strap, sundress, tankstyle, sleeveless, low-cut, back exposed, or revealing in any way.
- No vinyl, leather, suede, fleece, spandex/stretch, oversized pockets, pajamas, overalls, sweatpants, or coveralls.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.
- Underclothes may not be worn as outer clothes including men's T shirts.

OUTSIDE JACKETS AND COATS

- All jackets/coats that are ¾ lengths (or less) are acceptable.
- "Trench" coats or "Dusters" are not allowed.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.

SHOES

- Shoes must be safe and appropriate for school.
- No house slippers, slides, flip flops, or shoes with skates, wheels or cleats.

HAIR

- Hair (including facial hair) must be neat, clean, and well-groomed.

2017 - 2018 Texas Minimum State Vaccine Requirements for Students Grades K - 12

This chart summarizes the vaccine requirements incorporated in the Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Title 25 Health Services, §§97.61-97.72. This document is not intended as a substitute for the TAC, which has other provisions and details. The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is granted authority to set immunization requirements by the Texas Education Code, Chapter 38.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

A student shall show acceptable evidence of vaccination prior to entry, attendance, or transfer to a child-care facility or public or private elementary or secondary school in Texas.

Receipt of the dose up to (and including) 4 days before the birthday will satisfy the school entry immunization requirement.

Serologic evidence of infection or serologic confirmation of immunity to measles, mumps, rubella, hepatitis B, hepatitis A, or varicella is acceptable in place of vaccine.

Previous illness may be documented with a written statement from a physician, school nurse, or the child's parent or guardian containing wording such as: "This is to verify that (name of student) had varicella disease (chickenpox) on or about (date) and does not need varicella vaccine." This written statement will be acceptable in place of any and all varicella vaccine doses required.

Exemptions

Texas law allows (a) physicians to write medical exemption statements that the vaccine(s) required would be medically harmful or injurious to the health and well-being of the child or household member, and (b) parents/guardians to choose an exemption from immunization requirements for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief. The law does not allow parents/guardians to elect an exemption simply because of inconvenience (for example, a record is lost or incomplete and it is too much trouble to go to a physician or clinic to correct the problem). Schools should maintain an up-to-date list of students with exemptions, so they may be excluded in times of emergency or epidemic declared by the commissioner of public health.

Instructions for requesting the official exemption affidavit that must be signed by parents/guardians choosing the exemption for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief, can be found at www.ImmunizeTexas.com under "School & Child-Care." The original Exemption Affidavit must be completed and submitted to the school.

For children claiming medical exemptions, a written statement by the physician must be submitted to the school. Unless it is written in the statement that a lifelong condition exists, the exemption statement is valid for only one year from the date signed by the physician.

Provisional Enrollment

All immunizations should be completed by the first date of attendance. The law requires that students be fully vaccinated against the specified diseases. A student may be enrolled provisionally if the student has an immunization record that indicates the student has received at least one dose of each specified age-appropriate vaccine required by this rule. To remain enrolled, the student must complete the required subsequent doses in each vaccine series on schedule and as rapidly as is medically feasible and provide acceptable evidence of vaccination to the school. A school nurse or school administrator shall review the immunization status of a provisionally enrolled student every 30 days to ensure continued compliance in completing the required doses of vaccination. If, at the end of the 30-day period, a student has not received a subsequent dose of vaccine, the student is not in compliance and the school shall exclude the student from school attendance until the required dose is administered.

Additional guidelines for provisional enrollment of students transferring from one Texas public or private school to another, students who are dependents of active duty military, students in foster care, and students who are homeless can be found in the TAC, Title 25 Health Services, Sections 97.66 and 97.69.

Documentation

Since many types of personal immunization records are in use, any document will be acceptable provided a physician or public health personnel has validated it. The month, day, and year that the vaccination was received must be recorded on all school immunization records created or updated after September 1, 1991.

- Lunch Money Now (LMN) We encourage all parents to set up a LMN reminder at the beginning of the school year. It is a convenient way for parents to receive not only an email but also a text that your student's balance is low or has reached a preset dollar amount. LMN also allows parents to set up recurring payments to your student's account and view account balances. Visa, MasterCard, and PayPal can be used to make deposits on the secure (SSL) site and are available on the student's account within an hour of the transaction. There is a small \$2.50 charge per transaction and multiple students can have money deposited in a single transaction. Parents and guardians who prefer to make their payment in person may do so daily in the cafeteria.
- Meal Prices for school lunches will increase slightly for the 2017-2018 school year for elementary and high school students. This is a required increase using the United States Department of Agriculture Equity Tool. All other lunch prices and breakfast meal prices will stay the same.

District Meal Charge Policy:

The meal charge policy must be communicated in writing to all households at the start of each school year and to households transferring to the school during the school year. This charge policy will be included in with the 'letter to households' about the free and reduced meal program.

Student Verbal Reminder Daily: When account balance is negative an automated call and an email will occur and continue until the account is brought to a positive balance. Parent may use <u>Lunch Money Now</u> online or bring cash or check to cashier before 2 p.m.


