Welcome to APHG. Congratulations on taking an advanced academic subject! This class is relevant as it gives a great foundation for many of the classes you will take throughout your high school and college career. It is also rigorous and will require you to spend time studying and preparing for class. Most of all though, the class is interesting and I try very hard to make the learning of the material enjoyable.

Your summer assignment has two parts. The first is to create a series of maps to learn the physical features and political boundaries of this world. This is to prepare you for six map tests over the course of the year. See the attached check lists and outline maps and complete each of the maps as instructed. To complete this assignment, you must purchase a box of map pencils and a world atlas. You will be using the atlas during the year as well, so keep that in mind when you are making your selection. Make the maps neat and readable. Some guidelines for labeling and a grading rubric are on the page following the outline maps. **Assemble all of the maps in a folder to submit no later than Friday, August 28, 2018**. The project will be considered late after that date and the grade will reflect the late work policy included with the rubric. These maps will be your first **Test Grade** of the school year in this class.

The second part of your summer assignment is to complete the website scavenger hunt for the National History Day website. As an AP student, you will be required to participate in History Fair. This assignment is to prepare you for the project starting in the first nine weeks of school. All of the guidelines, rules and requirements of the project are covered on the NHD website. It will be your main source of instruction and direction for the project. Go to the website <a href="www.nhd.org">www.nhd.org</a> and complete all activities on the worksheet. This scavenger hunt will be due no later than August 28, 2018 with NO EXCEPTIONS. The project will be considered late after that date and the grade will reflect the late work policy included with the map rubric. This activity will be your first Quiz Grade of the school year in this class.

You will have online access to the textbook when school begins; however, if you wish to purchase the textbook, you may. This will allow you to highlight and annotate your book. The textbook is Rubenstein, James, M. *The Cultural Landscape: An Introduction to Human Geography.* 11ed. Upper Saddle River, NJ: Prentice Hall, 2011. ISBN 978-0-321-83158-3 You can also find some used textbooks at local used book stores or any bookseller web site like Amazon.com, or half.com.

If you choose to purchase the textbook, I encourage you to look through it and become familiar with its structure and style. If you wish to get a head start on the school year, feel free to read and take notes on Chapter 1, Basic Concepts, pages 1-43, and the Appendix pages 476-482.

- Use a different colored pencil for each territory on political maps. Try not to have like colors next to each other.
- Physical maps AND regional maps must have a key.
- Make your maps neat and readable. You want to be able to use them to study for your map tests.
