This is to prepare you for a History Fair Project you will be required to participate in starting in the first nine weeks of school. All of the guidelines, rules and requirements of the project are covered in the NHD website. It will be your main source of instruction and direction for the project. Go to the website <a href="www.nhd.org">www.nhd.org</a> and complete all activities on the worksheet. This scavenger hunt will be due to your class tray no later than August 28, 2018 with NO EXCEPTIONS. This activity will be your first Quiz Grade of the school year in this class.

- Use only colored pencils on a map. The water (and only the water) is colored blue.
- When labeling countries, territories, states, cities, etc. use only black ink.
- Use a different colored pencil for each territory on political maps. Try not to have like colors next to each other.
- Physical maps AND regional maps must have a key.
- Make your maps neat and readable. You want to be able to use them to study for your map tests.
