Dickinson ISD develops junior high boundaries for the opening of Kranz Junior High in August 2018

In preparation for the opening of Eugene Kranz Junior High in August, Dickinson ISD has worked with a demographer this school year to create the district's first-ever junior high boundaries which were approved in February by the Board of Trustees.

All Dickinson ISD seventh and eighth grade students currently attend McAdams Junior High; however, with enrollment surpassing 1,600 students, a second junior high is needed to alleviate the growing enrollment. The new junior high attendance boundaries divide the district in half with a north/south split in the general area of FM 517. The north side of the district will be zoned to Kranz Junior High, while students living in the south side of the district will attend McAdams Junior High.

Kranz Junior High, which will house the district's junior high STEM Academy, is anticipated to open with just over 900 students, while McAdams will house a little more than 800 students. The McAdams enrollment is starting lower to allow for the continued growth on the south side of the district in the Lago Mar subdivision.

The district mailed letters to parents of all current sixth and seventh grade students to inform them about which school their child will attend next school year based on the new boundaries. A detailed map can be found on the school district website at www.dickinsonisd.org and maps are available in the front office at the district's middle schools, McAdams Junior High and the Education Support Center.

Dickinson ISD approves new school times for 2018-2019

Dickinson ISD will have new school times for 2018-2019. This will address the continued growth of the district and the need for additional bus routes.

Dickinson ISD is one of only a few districts that provides bus service for all students, regardless of their proximity to the school. It is a service the district has always provided due to the lack of sidewalks and dangerous walking conditions in many parts of the school district.

The district hopes that by announcing these new school times now, it gives employees and parents several months to make arrangements for the start of the new school year on Monday, August 20, 2018.

Online Registration available for Returning Students

From August 1-15, 2018, Dickinson ISD parents will be able to take advantage of the district's online registration process for returning students. These are students who attend a Dickinson ISD campus at the end of the 2017-2018 school year and will be returning for the 2018-2019 school year.

A copy of proof of residency is still required to be dropped off at the campus; however, this can be done during regular office hours between August 1-15.

The online registration process will be available through the school district website at www.dickinsonisd.org. The district will have complete instructions on the website this summer to walk parents through the steps they need to take.

In order to complete the online registration process, parents must have their login information (user name and password) for Skyward Family Access. **If a parent does not have login information, this can be obtained by showing proper identification in the front office at their child's school.** Please make sure you have obtained login information ahead of time so you are not delayed in registering your student online. For parents without access to the Internet, computers and assistance will be available at the campuses during designated times to complete the online registration process.

Parents of students new to Dickinson ISD for 2018-2019 must visit the campus their child will attend and complete the registration process in person as there is more paperwork involved.

Returning students to Dickinson ISD may complete the online registration process:

Online registration will be available August 1-15, 2018 for families of returning Dickinson ISD students through the Skyward Family Access Site. A copy of proof of residency is still required. **Please drop off a copy of proof of residency at the front office to your child's elementary school between the hours of 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. Monday-Friday, August 1-15, 2018. Please put the name(s) of your student(s) and their grade level for 2018-2019 on the proof of residency so we can validate your residential status for all students active at our campus.** Proof of Residency includes a current gas, water, electricity bill or lease in the parent's name. If the bill/lease is NOT in parent/guardian's name, additional forms will be required including the service of a notary to complete the registration process in order to validate enrollment.

Assistance for individuals who request help with online registration will be offered at campuses during New Student Registration from 1-7 p.m. August 6 and 8 a.m.-12 p.m. August 7.

New Students to Dickinson ISD must register at the appropriate campus in person on one of the two dates below:

When coming to register your new DISD student(s), parents/guardians must bring COPIES of the following documents for each child Pre-Kindergarten through 4th grade:

- Student's Birth Certificate, Immunization Record, Social Security Card, Medication information
- Valid parent ID, (Driver's License, passport, military ID);
- Court paperwork for Guardianship(s);
- Proof of Residency (current gas, water, electricity bill or lease in parent's name; If the bill/lease is NOT in parent/guardian's name, additional forms will be required including the service of a notary to complete the registration process in order to validate enrollment;
- Copy of Divorce/Custody documents, if applicable;
- Special Education/Section 504 information, if applicable;
- Copy of last report card if transferring from another District.

Kindergarten students must be 5 years old on or before September 1. Pre-Kindergarten students must be 4 years old on or before September 1 and meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Student is unable to speak or comprehend the English language;
- Student is economically disadvantaged with proof parental/family income & benefits;
- Student is homeless;
- Student is child of active duty member of the U.S. Armed Forces
- Student is the child of a member of the U.S. Armed Forces that was killed or injured while on active duty;
- Student is or ever was in the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services following an adversary hearing.

New Student Registration:

Enrollment paperwork for high school students new to the district may be picked up at any time during summer office hours. The paperwork is available in the front office of the high school.

New students MUST be accompanied by parent or guardian at registration and should bring all required documents.

Current Student Registration:

For 2018-2019, Dickinson ISD will use an online process for current student registration. Please drop off a copy of proof of residency at the front office between the hours of 7 a.m. - 3 p.m. Monday-Friday, July 30 - August 15 or email it to lcook@dickinsonisd.org. Please put the name(s) of your student(s) and their grade level for the 2018-2019 school year on the document. Proof of Residency includes a current gas, water, electricity bill or lease in the parent's name. Additional forms will be required, possibly including the service of a notary, to complete the registration process in order to validate enrollment if the bill/lease is NOT in the parent/guardian's name.

August 1- August 15, 2018

Online Registration for all current DISD students will be open August 1-15, 2018. Parents must have access to Skyward in order to do the registration process. The student's Skyward access does not have the capabilities to do the online registration. Instructions for completing the online registration are available on the Dickinson ISD website. All address changes require proof of residence (current water/electric/gas bill, lease agreement or property tax statement). Proof of residence may be dropped off in the front office. Students not registered by August 15 may not have bus transportation for approximately one week unless there is already a designated stop.

August 6 - August 7, 2018

DHS will have a computer lab open from 7:30-11 a.m. and 12-3 p.m. to assist families with completing the online registration process.

First Day Schedule Pick-up, August 20, 2018

All Dickinson High School students will report to their NaviGATOR class on the first day of school, August 20, 2018. Student names will be posted in various locations around the building indicating the student's assigned NaviGATOR room number. During NaviGATOR, student schedules will be distributed.

Parking Permits

Parking permits are required for all student vehicles. Students will be assigned a parking space in a designated school parking lot. In order to purchase a parking permit, students must present a valid Texas Driver's License and proof of insurance for the vehicle with the student listed as an authorized driver. Parking spaces are limited and will be sold on a space-available basis. Parking permits must be permanently affixed to the inside of the front windshield on the lower right-hand (passenger) side of the windshield. Parking permits are NOT TRANSFERRABLE to a vehicle other than the one for which the permit was purchased. Any vehicle parked in the school parking lot without a valid parking permit is subject to removal at the owner's expense. Parking permits are \$30 each and will be available for purchase the first week of school and on an as needed basis throughout the school year.

Dickinson Continuation Center

DHS students who applied for DCC AND have RECEIVED an acceptance letter must attend the mandatory parent/student DCC meeting at 10 a.m. August 14, 2018 on the DCC campus. Current proof of residency must be brought in at this time. Computers will be available at the meeting to complete online registration. DCC online registration will be open from August 10-15.

GRADES PK-6

PANTS, SLACKS, JEANS, SKIRTS, DRESSES, JUMPERS, SHORTS, SHIRTS, BLOUSES OR PULLOVERS:

- May be any color or design
- Shall be appropriately sized with no holes or tears, fitting at the waist, and cuffed/hemmed at or below mid-calf.
- Shorts may be no shorter than mid-thigh in length with a hem. No cut off shorts or athletic/gym shorts.
- The length/slots of skirts, dresses, and jumpers must be clearly below mid-thigh.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers must have sleeves and must be appropriately sized and buttoned.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers may not be sheer, lace, or any see-through material (even if worn with an undergarment/ camisole/slip), backless, cut-out, off-the-shoulder, spaghetti strap, sundress, tank-style, sleeveless, low-cut, back exposed, or revealing in any way
- No vinyl, leather, suede, fleece, spandex/stretch, oversized pockets, pajamas, overalls, sweatpants, or coveralls.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.
- Underclothes may not be worn as outer clothes, including men's T shirts.

OUTSIDE JACKETS AND COATS

- All jackets/coats that are ¾ lengths (or less) are acceptable.
- "Trench" coats or "Dusters" are not allowed.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.

SHOES

- Shoes must be safe and appropriate for school.
- No house slippers, slides, flip flops, or shoes with skates, wheels or cleats.

HAIR

- Hair (including facial hair) must be neat, clean, and well-groomed.
- No distracting/extreme styles or unnatural coloring (pink, green, blue, etc.).

BACKPACKS

- May be any fabric.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.

PROHIBITED ITEMS:

- Glitter, writing or drawing on the face or skin
- Tattoos (temporary and permanent)
- Sunglasses
- Any type of head covering (no cap, hat, hair net, hair rollers, combs, or picks may be worn inside the building)
- Body piercing other than the ear

2018-2019 DICKINSON ISD DRESS EXPECTATIONS

GRADES 7-12

PANTS, SLACKS, JEANS, SKIRTS, DRESSES, JUMPERS, (NO SHORTS OR SKORTS), SHIRTS, BLOUSES OR PULLOVERS:

- May be any color or design
- Shall be appropriately sized with no holes or tears, fitting at the waist, and cuffed/hemmed at or below mid-calf
- The length/slits of skirts, dresses, and jumpers must be clearly below, and remain below, the mid-thigh, including the front, back, and sides when standing, sitting, or walking.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers must have sleeves. Must be appropriately sized and buttoned.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers may not be sheer, lace, or any see-through material (even if worn with an undergarment/camisole/slip), backless, cut-out, off-the-shoulder, spaghetti strap, sundress, tank-style, sleeveless, low-cut, back exposed, or revealing in any way.
- No vinyl, leather, suede, fleece, spandex/stretch, oversized pockets, pajamas, overalls, sweatpants, or coveralls.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.
- Underclothes may not be worn as outer clothes including men's T shirts.

OUTSIDE JACKETS AND COATS

- All jackets/coats that are $\frac{3}{4}$ lengths (or less) are acceptable.
- "Trench" coats or "Dusters" are not allowed.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.

SHOES

- Shoes must be safe and appropriate for school.
- No house slippers, slides, flip flops, or shoes with skates, wheels or cleats.

HAIR

- Hair (including facial hair) must be neat, clean, and well-groomed.
- No distracting/extreme styles or unnatural coloring (pink, green, blue, etc.).

BACKPACKS

- May be any fabric.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.

PROHIBITED ITEMS:

2018 - 2019 Texas Minimum State Vaccine Requirements for Students Grades K - 12

This chart summarizes the vaccine requirements incorporated in the Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Title 25 Health Services, §§97.61-97.72. This document is not intended as a substitute for the TAC, which has other provisions and details. The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is granted authority to set immunization requirements by the Texas Education Code, Chapter 38.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

A student shall show acceptable evidence of vaccination prior to entry, attendance, or transfer to a child-care facility or public or private elementary or secondary school in Texas.

³ Previous illness may be documented with a written statement from a physician, school nurse, or the child's parent or guardian containing wording such as: "This is to verify that (name of student) had varicella disease (chickenpox) on or about (date) and does not need varicella vaccine." This written statement will be acceptable in place of any and all varicella vaccine doses required.

Exemptions

Texas law allows (a) physicians to write medical exemption statements that the vaccine(s) required would be medically harmful or injurious to the health and well-being of the child or household member, and (b) parents/guardians to choose an exemption from immunization requirements for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief. The law does not allow parents/guardians to elect an exemption simply because of inconvenience (for example, a record is lost or incomplete and it is too much trouble to go to a physician or clinic to correct the problem). Schools should maintain an up-to-date list of students with exemptions, so they may be excluded in times of emergency or epidemic declared by the commissioner of public health.

Instructions for requesting the official exemption affidavit that must be signed by parents/guardians choosing the exemption for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief, can be found at www.ImmunizeTexas.com under "School & Child-Care." The original Exemption Affidavit must be completed and submitted to the school.

For children claiming medical exemptions, a written statement by the physician must be submitted to the school. Unless it is written in the statement that a lifelong condition exists, the exemption statement is valid for only one year from the date signed by the physician.

Provisional Enrollment

All immunizations should be completed by the first date of attendance. The law requires that students be fully vaccinated against the specified diseases. A student may be enrolled provisionally if the student has an immunization record that indicates the student has received at least one dose of each specified age-appropriate vaccine required by this rule. To remain enrolled, the student must complete the required subsequent doses in each vaccine series on schedule and as rapidly as is medically feasible and provide acceptable evidence of vaccination to the school. A school nurse or school administrator shall review the immunization status of a provisionally enrolled student every 30 days to ensure continued compliance in completing the required doses of vaccination. If, at the end of the 30-day period, a student has not received a subsequent dose of vaccine, the student is not in compliance and the school shall exclude the student from school attendance until the required dose is administered.

Additional guidelines for provisional enrollment of students transferring from one Texas public or private school to another, students who are dependents of active duty military, students in foster care, and students who are homeless can be found in the TAC, Title 25 Health Services, Sections 97.66 and 97.69.

Documentation

Since many types of personal immunization records are in use, any document will be acceptable provided a physician or public health personnel has validated it. The month, day, and year that the vaccination was received must be recorded on all school immunization records created or updated after September 1, 1991.

FNS staff will assist parents with applications at all schools and the main office at 4003 Video St. Paper applications can be requested.
- **Lunch Money Now (LMN)** – We encourage all parents to set up a LMN account to view your students meals and snacks eaten daily. It is a convenient way for parents to receive not only an email but also a text that your student's balance is low or has reached a preset dollar amount. Parents with students on the Free and Reduced meal program can also utilize LMN. It allows parents to set up recurring payments to your student's account and view account balances. Visa, MasterCard, and PayPal can be used to make deposits on the secure (SSL) site and are available on the student's account within an hour of the transaction. There is a small \$2.50 charge per transaction and multiple students can have money deposited in a single transaction. Parents and guardians who prefer to make their payment in person may do so daily in the cafeteria.
- **Meal Prices will not increase for the 2018-2019 school year.**
 - * Breakfast: Free for all students
 - * Universal **Free Breakfast** will be provided for the 2018-19 school year on a trial basis for one year. We will re-evaluate for the 2019-20 school year.
 - * Reduced Price Students: The \$.30 Breakfast and \$.40 Lunch Payment for Reduced students **will be Eliminated.**

Lunch Prices: Remain the same as 2017-2018.

* Reduced Price – (\$.40 Lunch Payment for Reduced students **will be Eliminated**)

- **Other Information:** Menus, health and fitness materials, policy and procedures, and much more are available on our food and nutrition website.

- **District Meal Charge Policy:**

The meal charge policy must be communicated in writing to all households at the start of each school year and to households transferring to the school during the school year. This charge policy will be included in with the 'letter to households' about the free and reduced program.

When account balance is negative an automated call and an email will occur and continue until the account is brought to a positive balance. Parent may use Lunch Money Now online or bring cash or check to cashier before 2 p.m.

If FNS has not received payment and the charge amounts to \$15.00 then FNS will send a U.S. Postal letter to the parent to remind them we have been feeding the child in good faith, and that money is owed to the student's account. Automated calls will continue. If after being notified by mail and FNS has not received payment and the charge is \$20.00 or more FNS managers will contact their school principal to make contact with the parent. A decision will be made by the Principal to either continue feeding the child in good faith or discontinue feeding at school. The parent will be informed to feed their child breakfast at home and send a lunch to school until their child's account is made positive.

Dickinson ISD will collect on all unpaid meal charges. The parent/guardian is responsible to repay any charges that have accrued before the end of the school year and for charges made prior to application approval. All charges will be carried over to the students account the following year. We will stop taking checks 2 weeks before the end of school.

- **In-Sufficient Checks:** Checks returned for insufficient funds will not be accepted for future payments and will be charged a fee and assessed to the student account. Cash, money orders or using Lunch Money Now will be the only forms of payment.

2018-2019 Procedures for Families Displaced Due to Hurricane Harvey

As we prepare for the 2018-2019 school year, the following procedures are in place for students and families that were displaced during the 2017-2018 school year due to Hurricane Harvey.

Homeless status and services discontinue at the end of each school year. With this in mind, Dickinson ISD will not be able to re-enroll children for 2018-2019 that were displaced due to the hurricane without further residency documentation.

If a family displaced from the hurricane resides within the boundaries of Dickinson ISD in August 2018, parents will need to re-enroll the child by providing a current light, gas or water bill with the parent's name and address listed.

If the family shares a residence with another party, parents will need to provide the required proof of residency along with a notarized residency affidavit in order to re-enroll the child.

If in August 2018, the family resides within Dickinson ISD but outside the campus boundaries for the campus the child attended last school year, parents will need to enroll the child at the campus they are currently zoned to attend or complete an in-district transfer request.

If a family displaced from the hurricane no longer resides within the boundaries of Dickinson ISD, the parents will need to enroll the child in the school district in which the family is currently residing or complete an out of district transfer request requesting to remain in Dickinson ISD. These requests will be accepted July 16-19 from 8-11 a.m. or 12-4 p.m. in the district's Education Support Center, 2218 FM 517 East in Dickinson.
