## Class Procedures

Every student pledges to be Prepared, Prompt, Polite, and Positive. Please ask your child to explain these to you. They are character-building behaviors. We will discuss how to incorporate these important behaviors into our lives at school as well as outside the classroom through our SWAMP values lessons during AVID/Homeroom.
A. Prepared: Students need to have proper supplies and completed classroom and homework assignments.
B. Prompt: Students need to be in their desks with supplies ready, and working on math warm-ups when class starts.
C. Polite: Students will pay attention and not talk during instructions. Students will follow instructions. Students will be respectful to the teacher and classmates.
D. Positive: Students should display a positive attitude towards their teacher, fellow students, and classroom instructions/tasks.

## Classroom Management Behavior

Students are expected to manage their behavior in class by being attentive, co-operative, engaged in the learning of the daily skills, and by completing their daily classwork and/or homework. I give tickets for weekly drawings. Some of the ways students can earn tickets are as follows:
-answering questions

- participating in class discussions
-showing kindness to another student
-being caught up on work for the week
- perfect attendance for the week


## Homework Policy

I will not be sending home a standard daily homework assignment. The only form of homework that will be assigned will be in the form of test reviews for skill tests, CBA's, benchmarks, and STAAR review.

Students may have work they need to do at home, such as:
-completion of daily work (student needs extra time to complete)
-redo (student earned a grade lower than 70 on an assignment)
-absent work
-completion of work (work not completed during Remote Learning)

## Absences/Make-Up Policy:

If a student is absent, he/she will need to make up their assignments, tests, or quizzes. Students will have the same number of days they were absent to make up
work. Student should consult with the teacher after an absence to identify any work that needs to be completed. Students are responsible for making sure that they have received missed work, completing the assignments, and turning assignments in to his/her teacher within the time period specified by the number of days of his/her absence. If a student does not turn in assignments, he/she will receive a zero.

## Late Class Work (does not include absent work -see above)

1 day late - grade may be reduced up to a maximum of 10 points 2 days late - grade may be reduced up to a maximum of 20 points. 3 days late - grade may be reduced up to a maximum of 30 points.

## Corrections

If a student earns a grade of $70 \%$ or less on an assignment, the student may correct and return the assignment for additional credit up to a $70 \%$. Corrections are due the day following the receipt of the graded assignment. Students are encouraged to attend tutorials if grades consistently fall at the $70 \%$ or lower range.

Tutoring: Tutoring will be available for fifth and sixth grade students during our AVID/HR periods and/or set up during scheduled, as-needed pull-outs from electives/PE with the approval of parents and teacher.

## Academic Dishonesty

A student found cheating, or aiding in cheating, will receive a grade of zero on the assignment and the teacher will contact the parent. Cheating will include the possession of another's assignment.
