<p style="text-align: center;"><b>MAKE A PLAN</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Ensure your child attends school every day and arrives on time.</li> <li>● Attend School events and activities whenever possible.</li> <li>● Create and monitor a SKYWARD account to track grades, attendance, and discipline.</li> <li>● Keep contact information current.</li> <li>● Establish a consistent homework and reading routine.</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>MAKE A PLAN</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Bring all necessary supplies to school each day.</li> <li>● Complete and submit all assignments on time.</li> <li>● Make up all missed work when absent.</li> <li>● Set aside time each day for homework, studying, and reading.</li> <li>● Set academic goals for each class and develop a plan for achieving them.</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>MAKE A PLAN</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Review student achievement data regularly.</li> <li>● Collaboratively plan instruction with colleagues.</li> <li>● Use research-based instructional strategies.</li> <li>● Provide high-quality, grade level Tier I instruction for all students.</li> <li>● Maintain classroom routines, systems, and effective management strategies to ensure a secure learning environment.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>STAY CONNECTED</b></p> <p>Ask your child each evening:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● What is one thing you learned today?</li> <li>● What is a new word you learned today?</li> <li>● What are you looking forward to learning tomorrow?</li> <li>● What would you like to learn more about at school?</li> <li>● Tell me about the book you are reading.</li> <li>● What did you write about today?</li> <li>● Tell me about an interesting thing you learned in math, science, or social studies today.</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>COMMUNICATE with PARENTS</b></p> <p>Tell you parents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● What is going well at school.</li> <li>● What you need help with.</li> <li>● Who your friends are.</li> <li>● Something fun that happened at school today.</li> <li>● I have concerns or worries about...</li> <li>● I am reading...</li> <li>● I wrote about...</li> <li>● I learned _____ in social studies/science/math today...</li> <li>● We are singing _____ in music class.</li> <li>● My favorite art activity is...</li> <li>● I'm learning about how to stay healthy in PE by...</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>COMMUNICATE with STUDENTS AND PARENTS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Schedule and participate in parent-teacher conferences</li> <li>● Regularly communicate student progress and achievement.</li> <li>● Discuss student strengths and areas of growth.</li> <li>● Share achievement goals and progress toward those goals.</li> <li>● Build positive, trusting relationships with the students and families.</li> </ul>

<p><b>ENCOURAGE Daily READING</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Encourage at least 30 minutes of reading each day in a quiet place.</li> <li>● Discuss what your child is reading.</li> <li>● Provide access to reading materials either print or digital.</li> <li>● Limit on-line, gaming activities.</li> </ul>	<p><b>READ EVERY DAY</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Carry a book with you whenever possible.</li> <li>● Bring your book to lunch.</li> <li>● Read independently when assigned work is completed. .</li> <li>● Commit to being a strong reader and writer.</li> <li>● Read a minimum of 30 minutes each day at home.</li> </ul>	<p><b>TEACH LITERACY</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Emphasize the importance of strong reading and writing skills.</li> <li>● Model effective reading and writing practices. .</li> <li>● Integrate literacy into all content areas.</li> <li>● Plan instruction that supports literacy.</li> <li>● Teach state standards using research-based strategies.</li> <li>● Provide targeted intervention when needed.</li> </ul>
<p><b>SUPPORT MATH FLUENCY</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Monitor at least 10 minutes of math fact practice daily.</li> <li>● Use flash cards or online resources such as Khan Academy, IXL, or ZEARN.</li> <li>● Practice math through daily activities such as grocery shopping, saving allowance money, dividing treats to share with others.</li> </ul>	<p><b>PRACTICE MATH FACTS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Practice math facts daily.</li> <li>● Master math facts through 12.</li> <li>● Use flash cards and online resources to strengthen mathematics fluency. .</li> </ul>	<p><b>TEACH MATHEMATICS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Teach effective problem solving process(es)</li> <li>● Teach State standards using research-based strategies</li> <li>● Integrate reading/writing into mathematics instruction.</li> <li>● Provide intervention and enrichment as needed.</li> </ul>
