ENRIQUE "KIKI" CAMARENA

He was a Drug Enforcement Administration Agent (DEA) who was tortured and killed in Mexico in 1985. In honor of Kiki's memory and his battle against illegal drugs, friends and neighbors began to wear red badges of satin. Parents then began to form coalitions using Camarena as their model while embracing his belief that one person can make a difference. These coalitions adopted the symbol of Camarena's memory, the RED RIBBON. Today , the Red Ribbon serves as a catalyst to mobilize communities to educate youth and encourage participation in drug prevention activities.

SAT/TSI-11th grade

The TSI test is a test that helps determine if students are ready for college-level coursework in English, Reading, and Math. The TSI is required for all incoming college students ni Texas who are not exempt, and the results determine whether a student is placed in college-level courses or a developmental course (remedial)

PSAT-9/10th grade

The PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test) is good preparation for the SAT and may yield college scholarships for top scorers. It gives students and parents guidance in terms of how they'll perform on the SAT test. It usually is the first time students are timed on an exam. It is organized and structured very differently than the STAAR/EOC exams.

October is FENTANYL Poisoning Awareness MONTH



House Bill (HB) 3144 (88th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2023) establishes the month of October as Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness Month to increase awareness of the dangers of fentanyl and potential overdoses. Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness Month may be regularly observed through appropriate community activities (Texas Government Code, §662.116). To help school systems plan and prepare to spread awareness during the month of October, the Fentanyl Response Communications Toolkit resources have been updated to support fentanyl poisoning awareness month.

FACTS FENTANY

Fentanyl is a type of drug called an opioid. Opioids are used to treat pain. Fentanyl is one of the strongest opioids on the market, and the illegal drug markets are lacing other street drugs with it. If the drug you are taking is laced with a deadly dose of fentanyl, you wouldn't be able to see it, taste it, or smell it.

THERE ARE TWO TYPES

PRESCRIPTION

Used in medical settings and prescribed by doctors to treat severe pain, such as postsurgery or advanced-stage cancer. The treatment and dosage are tailored to the prescribed person and should never be shared with others. Made through the illegal drug markets and can mimic the appearance of prescription drugs. It's often added to other street drugs to increase the potency of them. There is no way to know how much IMF is laced into other street drugs.

ILLICITLY MANUFACTURED

SIGNS OF AN OPIOID OVERDOSE

- Not responsive (losing consciousness / falling asleep)
- Limp body
- Slow, weak, or no breathing
- Choking or gurgling sounds
- Cold, clammy skin
- Bluish skin, lips, and fingertips
- Small, constricted pupils

IT IS AVAILABLE IN ALL 50 STATES AND CAN BE PURCHASED FROM A LOCAL PHARMACY WITHOUT A PRESCRIPTION IN MOST STATES. TRY TO KEEP THE PERSON AWAKE AND BREATHING.
