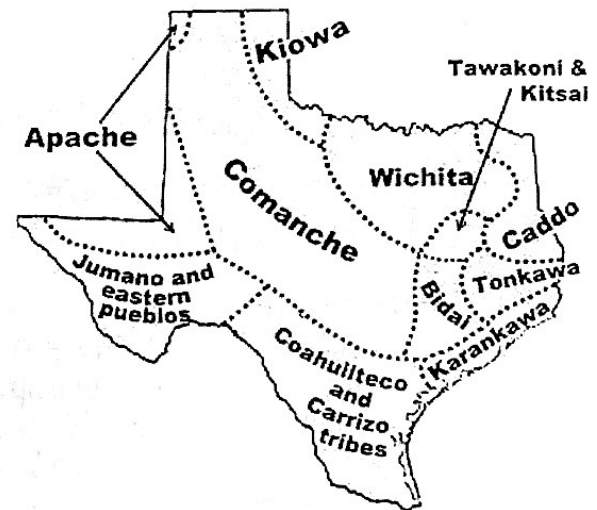

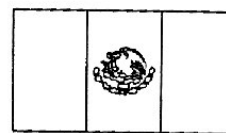
Did You Know?

6. Mexico outlawed slavery except Texas.

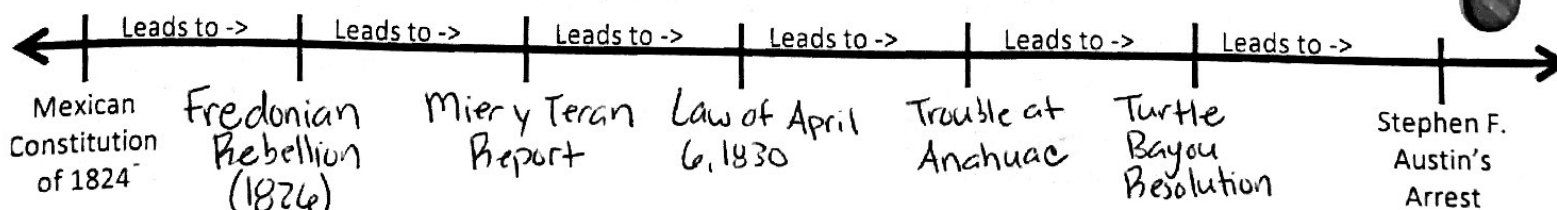

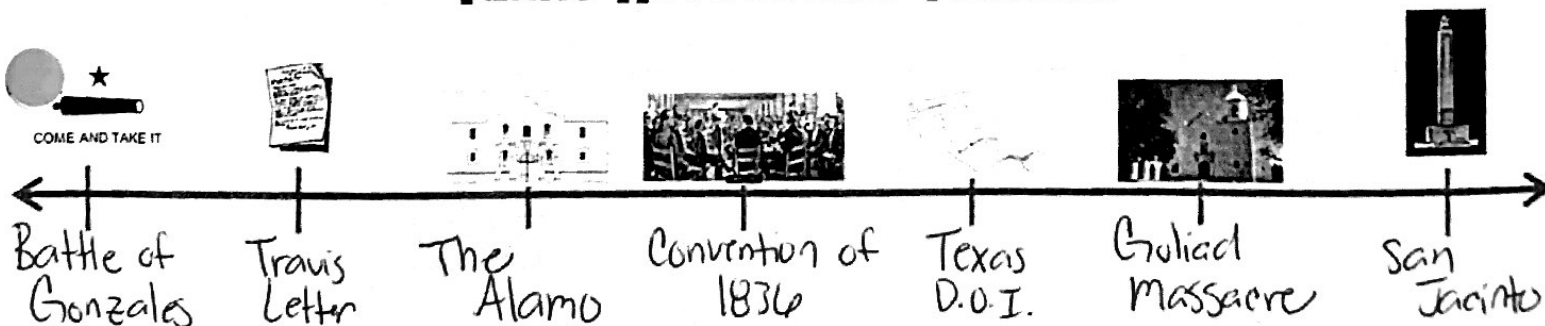
